The work "Fruiting" is part of one of the most characteristic painting series by Jan

Dobkowski. The painting was created at a time when the artist, together with Jerzy

Zieliński, belonged to the NEO-NEO-NEO art group. A series of large-format, smooth

paintings were then created, covered with clean, contrasting colours – most often red and

green. The artist operated with large surfaces of flat-laid paint and wavy, decorative lines.

The paintings show ambiguous, organic shapes resembling twisting plant shoots or

fragments of the human body. In the tangle of lines one can find bones, spine, and hands.

Rounded patches form the shape of hearts, lips and breasts, or fruit – apples and pears.

Jan Dobkowski's paintings are a manifestation of vitality, that is, a state full of vital energy.

Among the shapes depicted on the canvases, it is impossible to separate human and

plant forms – they are simply living organisms that come from the same source of nature.

Many works also feature distorted, tangled human figures. The artist was fascinated by

human biological life and the transformations that human bodies undergo – their shape

inside and outside. In his paintings, Dobkowski also explored the sphere of emotions,

presenting interpersonal relationships, desire and sexuality, as well as motherhood.
